Women into Manufacturing and Engineering Careers Fair

The Women into Manufacturing and Engineering (WiME) programme provides a platform for women from locally based companies to showcase their amazing Science, Engineering, Maths and Technology careers.

With great pay and progression opportunities, careers in our engineering, manufacturing, digital and renewable industries are a great choice for women and girls – but many female pupils stop being interested in STEM subjects at secondary school and don't go on to study them further or access apprenticeship opportunities.

To help show girls how exciting and varied these careers can be, we've invited amazing women working in some fantastic businesses across the region to our next careers event, taking place at **Grimsby Town Hall on Monday 4th March between 9.30am and 3.30pm.**

So far, we've got representatives from 24 companies attending – including ABP, Air Products, Anglian Water, Boston Energy, CldN, Centrica, C R Reynolds, Equinor, Morgan Sindall, OLG, Ops-Wind, ORE Catapult, Orsted, Phillips 66, Prax, Quickline, RWE, Royal Engineers, Rocal/Endurance Doors, Royal Engineers, Siemens Gamesa, Smith & Nephew, SSE and Tronox.

Teachers and Careers Leaders can sign up to bring along a group of students by requesting a booking form. We welcome groups from primary and secondary schools plus colleges.

We also have a public careers event from 4.30pm to 6.00pm, where women, older girls and pupils with their parents/carers can attend in their own time to find out more. We'd love your help to spread the word to parents and carers as we know how important their support is to students making career decisions. By sharing the WiME Grimsby public careers event, either on your website, in a newsletter, on your social media channels or by sending out a text message, you're helping parents/carers to understand the opportunities available, and ensuring more girls can attend this fantastic event.

Following both the launch of the new Local Area SEND Inspection framework in November 2022 and the SENDAP green Paper in March 2023, officers across education, health and care have worked with families, providers and a range of different teams and professionals to compose the first drafts of three key strategies for SEND in North East Lincolnshire.

With a significant focus on getting children with SEND and their families, the right support at the right time, we hope that these strategies identify where our priorities collectively across the borough are to further strengthen this offer.

We are keen to hear your feedback to be able to complete the final documents, which will then provide a clear direction of travel over the next five years. Consultations close on the 30 January 2024.

Partnership Grants for students with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND)

Schools can apply for funding to support investigative research projects that are specifically tailored for students with SEND.

The grant enables schools to purchase equipment to carry out investigative STEM research projects in science, mathematics, engineering or computing. By taking part in these projects, students will have the opportunity to develop essential skills, such as problem solving and data handling skills, readying them for the future world of work. An opportunity for year 12's to join an all-expenses paid, 4 day trip to the European Synchrotron Radiation Facility (ESRF), a world leading science research facility in Grenoble, France.

This amazing trip offers tours of the facilities, the opportunity to meet amazing scientists who live and work in Grenoble and also a little bit of sightseeing in this beautiful French city.

The entry process usually involves researching a

scientist of our choosing, about how findings from XMaS can be useful for society and why coming on the trip would be a good thing.

There are sixteen places available, and applications are welcome from Year 12 UK Physics and STEM students who identify as female.

Young People's Support Services (YPSS) Level 6 qualified Careers Advisers provide free impartial information advice and guidance to targeted students in key stage 4 across all academies in North East Lincolnshire and also attend some meetings for students in year 9 where possible.

We also offer additional purchased services such as careers guidance for students who fall outside our targeted service offer and single or 3 year destination tracking reports to assist academies with meeting responsibilities covered in the Careers Strategy and Gatsby Benchmarks.

YPSS hold the Matrix international standard for information advice and guidance services offering reassurance as to the quality of the information advice and guidance (IAG) given to young people.

As we enter a new term Rachel Reeve, YPSS' Management Information Specialist will be making contact with academies to request cohort lists so we can align services accordingly and ensure we have an accurate cohort information.
